- Inability to pass a bond or override
- ESSER Dollars Disappear 9/2024

- Staffing (Teachers, Support Staff, Administrators)
- Increase in private schools - ESAs driving enrollment challenges based on tuition-based private schools
- Maintaining Buildings - Funding from Capital
- Transwestern Pipeline & South Point Calpine Energy Center - overvaluation of property tax
- AEL (Prompting resolution to the K-12 AEL issue)
- Early Childhood and Full-day Funding - Kindergarten
